WINNERS in 10 categories in the annual Fremantle and East Fremantle heritage awards were announced last Thursday night.

More than 100 people attended the function in the Fremantle Maritime Museum to acknowledge Fremantle's unique heritage diversity.

Fremantle Mayor Peter Tagliaferri said Fremantle had much to celebrate in WA's 175th year.

"The City of Fremantle believes the retention and care of older buildings, historic areas and valued landscapes is of social and economic value, both in attracting tourism and contributing to an attractive and viable environment in which to live, work and play," he said.

Category winners were -

Significant contribution by an individual or group to Fremantle's social, cultural, built or natural heritage: Fremantle cemetery, Founders and Felons Self-Guided Tour.

The Spirit of Heritage, for individuals or groups who have undertaken special heritage projects: Richard Rennie, Fremantle Light and Sound.

No prize was awarded for harmonious infill development in a heritage place.
